- October -- set to run one time every 7 to 10 days
- November--set to run one time every two weeks
- <u>December & January</u> -- turn the controller OFF
- <u>February</u>— set to run one time every two weeks
- March, April, & May—set to run one time every 7 to 10 days
- <u>June</u>-- set to run one to two times per week
- July -- set to run two times per week
- August -- set to run one to two times per week



AERATION BENEFITS

Consider **aerating** your lawn this fall. Aeration involves perforating the soil, allowing air, water, and nutrients to penetrate the roots. This process reduces soil compaction and promotes healthier grass growth, making it an essential step in your lawncare routine.



FERTILIZING YOUR LAWN

Applying the right fertilizer in the fall is crucial for a lush lawn. Choose a high-quality, slow-release fertilizer rich in nitrogen. This will promote root growth and prepare your lawn for the winter months. Timing your application is essential for maximum effectiveness.







TURF & BED PRE-EMERGENT

Applying pre-emergent to your turf and beds in September will help control springtime weeds.

We recommend *Preen Lawn*Weed Control.













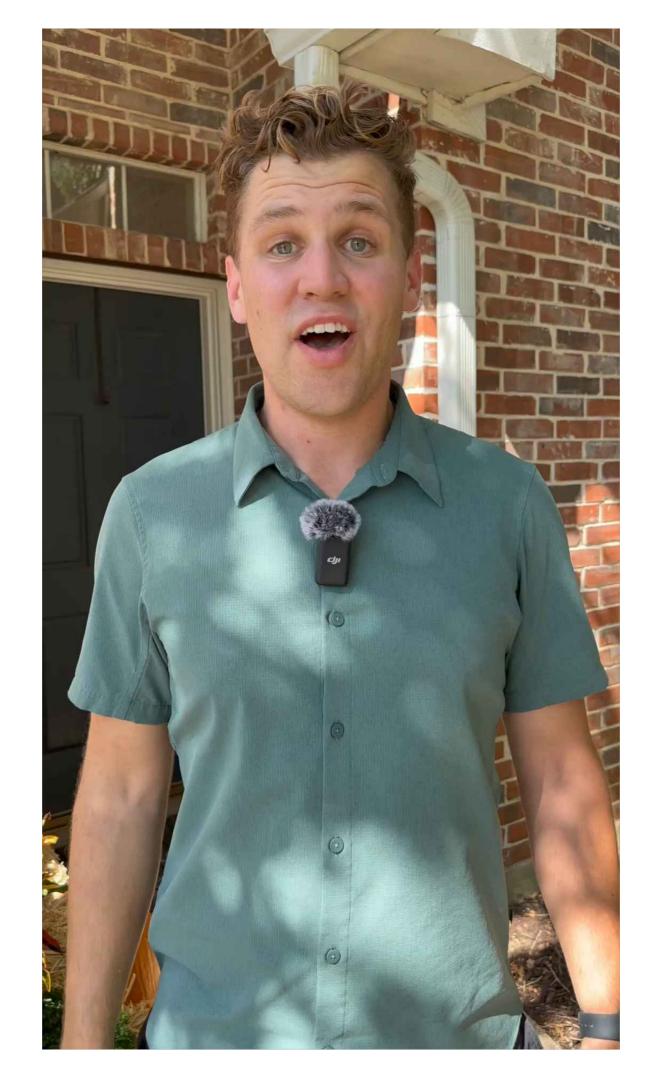


ADDING COLOR TO YOUR LANDSCAPE

- Safe in full sun
- Rabbit resistant









FLOWER FOCUS: COLORMAX MIX VIOLAS

- More significant than standard violas- more like "small pansies"
- Excellent cold weather and heat tolerance, unlike regular violas
- Full sun, partial sun, and partial shade
- Perfect for pots and baskets
- Mix combos for an abundance of color
- Maintain large bloom size













FLOWER FOCUS: SNAPTASTIC SNAPDRAGONS

- Pollinator-friendly
- Perfect for fall landscapes
- Flower best in a sunny spot
- Multicolored
- Sturdy
- Tall, upright flowers
- Grows happily in pots or beds
- Cut-and-come-again flowers
- Rabbit resistant
